An error was recently found on page 31 of the Landstone Communitites Amended Restated Development Order. In Table 1 – Roadways Improvements, showed CR 470 from Lake/Sumter County Line to Turnpike segment as 1.52 miles. The actual distance of that segment of roadway to be improved is 1.25 miles, as shown in the Proportionate Share Agreement.

Both the Amended Restated Development Order and Proportionate Share Agreement were approved by the Commission on December 13, 2010. The error has been corrected and the page will be replaced in the agreement currently awaiting signature at the Department of Community Affairs.

2. Phase 1 Improvements. ### **Executive Summary**

The City of Wildwood currently does not have any data on the location of the sidewalks within its city limits. The focus of this project was to locate and inventory the existing sidewalks within the City of Wildwood and to make a recommended phasing plan for the construction of new sidewalks that will improve the network.

Field research was conducted to locate, assess and inventory the existing sidewalks. This data was in turn inputted and cataloged into a GIS database so that the City has the information on file in a format that will allow for additional information to be inputted and future analyses completed.

The results of the study show there are 18.5 linear miles of sidewalks within the city limits. Aside from the FDOT sidewalks, the majority of the sidewalks are located on the east side of US 301 around city hall and the four schools. While many segments may need minor repairs, there are not any segments that are in need of replacement at this time.

A recommended phasing plan has been provided. The phasing is broken down into two phases. The phasing focuses on linking the schools with Millennium Park on the east side of US 301 and providing sidewalk access to Martin Luther King on the west side of US 301.

The collected data will provide benefits to the city. This data is the first step in creating the city's Sidewalk and Multimodal Master Plan and will also aid in applying for grants for construction of new sidewalks, such as the Safe Routes to Schools program administered by the Florida Department of Transportation.

## **Introduction**

This study conducts an inventory and assessment of the existing sidewalks in the City of Wildwood and captures the attributes of the sidewalks in a GIS database. This GIS database will allow for additional data to be inputted and will also allow city staff to conduct additional analyses in the future. The second component of this study is to recommend where the construction of new sidewalk segments will bring the best benefit to city residents. At the end of this report, six maps have been provided which illustrate the location of the existing sidewalks and the recommended location of future sidewalks.

It should be noted, the focus of this study is within the city's center where the majority of the sidewalks and population are located. There are other sidewalks within the city that have been accounted for but are not shown on the maps provided. Aside from the sidewalks along US 301, the sidewalks are predominately private and are associated with the Parkwood and Lakeside Landings developments in the northern portion of the city.

## **Project Goals**

This project was conducted with the attempt to achieve the following goals:

- ❖ Identify where the existing sidewalks are located within the City
- ❖ Assess and inventory the characteristics of the sidewalk
- ❖ Identify segments that are in need of replacement
- ❖ Create a GIS database that catalogs the data
- ❖ Recommend a sidewalk phasing schedule for the construction of new sidewalks and replacement sidewalks

### **Data Collection and Inventory**

A field study was conducted from October 15 – October 29, 2010 by walking and driving the City streets to identify the location of the sidewalks. The sidewalks were then assessed based on segment, width, condition, location (which side(s) of the street they were located on), placement (whether the sidewalk was located within the right-of-way) and status (whether or not the sidewalk was newly constructed). The sidewalks were hand drawn on a base map with a color coded theme.

The sidewalks were measured, and a judgment was made to determine the condition of the sidewalk. Initially, due to the uncertainty of the width or condition, the intention was to categorize the sidewalks as follows (width and condition):

- ❖ >5' – Good condition, no repairs needed
- ❖ >5' – Adequate condition, minor repairs possible
- ❖ >5' – Replacement needed
- ❖ <4' – Good condition, no repairs needed
- ❖ <4' – Adequate condition, minor repairs possible
- ❖ <4' – Replacement needed

### **Cataloging the Data in GIS**

The GIS database was generated to capture the data collected by creating a new shapefile (polyline) in ArcCatalog. The database was set up to index the sidewalk locations and characteristics. The database is inclusive of the characteristics identified during the assessment and is broken up by segment.

Cataloging the data in GIS is beneficial to the city. This user-friendly GIS database can now be used to conduct a variety of analyses such as determining where a sidewalk is located, the width and condition of the sidewalk, the length of the segment, and whether or not the sidewalk is known to be located within a right-of-way. This data will aid in the planning process as the city improves pedestrian infrastructure. This database will continually be modified as new sidewalks are constructed, priorities are given to future segments, or segments are identified to be replaced due to damage.

Additionally, some grants, such as the Florida Department of Transportation's "Safe Routes to School" program have data requirements. Prior to this study, the city was unable to seek grants because the data did not exist. While it's likely more detailed data (such as surveys) will be necessary to determine the exact location of the sidewalk, this database provides a good starting point.

### **Results**

The results of the study show the city currently has 18.5 linear miles of public sidewalks within the city limits. This figure is misleading, however, as 7.6 miles (41%) are located within the Florida Department of Transportation right-of-way of US 301 and SR 44. Private sidewalks are provided for the residents of Lakeside Landings and Parkwood in the northern part of the city. The sidewalks provided within those developments are isolated, and there is no opportunity to integrate those developments with other public sidewalks.

Most of the sidewalks are located within a few blocks of city hall and Gamble Street. The four schools (Wildwood Elementary, Wildwood Middle, North Sumter Primary, and Wildwood High School) are all accessible by sidewalk. The sidewalk

widths within the area vary from 4 feet to 5 feet. The condition of the sidewalk also varies, but there are not any segments in need of replacement. This is indicative of the continued upkeep by the public works department on the sidewalks the city does maintain. No sidewalks were present that were less than 4 feet wide or greater than 5 feet wide.

The residents on the west side of US 301 have sidewalk access along CR 44A and Jackson Street. However, sidewalk linkage to Martin Luther King Park is absent. Without any sidewalks, walking or bicycling to the park is an unattractive and unsafe option. Millennium Park, on the east side of US 301 does have sidewalks; however there is not a linkage to the four schools. Students walking or bicycling from the schools to Millennium Park must walk or ride on Huey Street for approximately 1,500 feet which creates a potentially dangerous situation.

### **Recommended Phasing**

Sidewalks provide a safe travel route, especially for children and those without an automobile, throughout the city. The recommended phasing plan that has been provided takes into account where the residents will reap the most benefit should new segments be constructed. The phasing plan consists of two phases. The first phase includes essential improvements that can be constructed. The second phase would implement segments that may be more difficult to construct. Both phases intend to provide linkage to schools and recreation areas.

The first phase is two fold: 1) Construct the missing link on the north side of Huey Street to complete the linkage between the schools and Millennium Park; 2)


Construct sidewalks along CR 238 and CR 213 to begin the sidewalk network for Martin Luther King Park.

The second phase is also two fold: 1) Construct a sidewalk along the north side of CR 44A to provide a southern link from the schools to Millennium Park thereby creating a continuous loop from US 301, CR 466A, Powell Road (fka CR 139), and Huey Street; 2) Construct sidewalks along CR 242 and High Street to link Martin Luther King Park with the existing sidewalk system on the west side of US 301.

### **Conclusion**

Sidewalks in the City of Wildwood exist where they are needed the most: around schools. Many areas of the city are absent of sidewalks. However, with minor improvements the city can greatly improve its sidewalk network that will benefit city residents. The GIS database can be modified as conditions change throughout the city.

This data will be important as the city starts work on the Sidewalk and Multimodal Master Plan that is required to be completed, per the comprehensive plan, by 2012. The City should investigate grant opportunities to help fund the construction of the recommended segments. The data collected as a result of this study is a good starting point for future analyses.

Aqua Pure Water & Sewage Service quoted \$15,490.00


Interstate Electric Services of Central Florida quoted \$15,750.00

# CONSTRUCTION PLANS FOR CR 214 PUMP STATION CONTROL VALVE



***Background***

The City of Wildwood (City) Coleman Water Treatment Plant (WTP) design incorporates a programmable logic controller (PLC) to operate the jockey pump and high service pump (HSP) #1 and #2. The existing HSP #3 is a standby pump operated by the Mercoid controller as a separate control system. Previously, the PLC was damaged by lightning resulting in loss of automatic control of the jockey pump and HSP #1 and #2. Since that time, the City has been operating the WTP using HSP #3 as the sole pumping source.

In October 2010, a pressure transient resulted in a water line separation inside the pump building. The water line separation cause flooding inside the pump building. Water levels reached up to 21 inches inside the building including the MCC room.

***Scope of Services***

As a temporary measure, the City desires to return the jockey pump and HSP #1 and #2 to automated control until the extent of damage and necessary permanent repairs can be determined. It is the City's intent to install a new PLC and human machine interface (HMI) to operate these pumps using variable frequency drives (VFD) based on an input signal from the existing pressure transmitter.

The services listed below shall include all parts, equipment and labor for a complete and working system. The services provided shall also include PLC programming with a lead – lag – lag operating strategy. Detailed startup testing, staff training, and one year warranty shall be included.

1. Provide and install a new PLC with HMI using identical / interchangeable components with Wildwood County Road 214 Plant system. Installation to include:
  - A. Complete installation of all control and power wiring for PLC in space available in existing motor control center cabinet.
  - B. Connection of all control wiring to motor controls, sensors and feedback outputs as required for a fully operational system.
  - C. Programming and Engineering support as required to develop program instructions for the stable operation of the plant with a control sequence that is similar to other plant owned by the City of Wildwood.



- ◆ Rotation of Lead / Lag status:
  - Designate Lead Pump as High Service Pump #1 (HSP-1) and Lag Pump as High Service Pump #2 (HSP-2) on initiation of control system.
  - On weekly time schedule reverse status of HSP-1 and HSP-2 from Lead to Lag and vice versa.
  - Monitor operating hours for each pump, when one pump accumulates more than 200 hours of operation greater than the other, allow the low time pump to remain in the lead status for an additional week.
- ◆ Lead Pump HSP-1 Initially:
  - Lead Pump Start - When plant discharge pressure drops below 54 PSI (adjustable setpoint), energize Lead Pump VFD.
    - Ramp pump speed up and look for proof of operation – Current draw on VFD to correspond with pump curve for associated RPM. In the event of low current draw, monitor plant discharge pressure, if pressure drops below 54 PSI – Initiate alarm, shut down Lead Pump and initiate start sequence of Lag High Service Pump.
    - Ramp VFD up until plant discharge pressure is 56 PSI (adjustable setpoint).
    - Use Proportional-Integral-Derivative (PID) controller to ramp VFD up or down to maintain setpoint.
  - If VFD is at minimum output (20%) and plant discharge pressure is 59 PSI (adjustable setpoint), initiate lead pump shut down sequence.
  - If VFD is at 90% output and plant discharge pressure drops to 54 PSI (adjustable setpoint) - Start Lag High Service Pump.
  - Monitor operational characteristics of high service pump, initiate alarm status for any monitored parameters operating outside preset limits.
- ◆ Lag Pump HSP-2 Initially:
  - Lag Pump Start - When plant discharge pressure drops below 54 PSI (adjustable setpoint) and lead pump is operating at 90% output, energize Lag Pump VFD.
    - Ramp pump speed up and look for proof of operation – Current draw on VFD to correspond with pump curve for associated RPM. In the event of low current draw, monitor plant discharge pressure, if pressure drops below 54 PSI – Initiate alarm, shut down Lag Pump.
    - Ramp VFD of lag pump up to 45% and allow Lead pump to ramp down until plant discharge pressure is 56 PSI (adjustable setpoint).

  - NEMA ICS 7.1 – Safety Standards for Construction and Guide for Selection, Installation, and Operation of Adjustable Speed Drive Systems.

#### Submittals

- ◆ Submit product data for Variable Frequency Drive (VFD). Include manufacturer, dimensions, ratings, listings, elementary power and control wiring diagrams and data on features and components. Any exceptions to the specification shall be clearly noted in the submittal.

#### Warranty

- ◆ The VFD shall be warranted by the manufacturer for a period of 30 months from date of shipment. The warranty shall include parts, labor, travel costs, and living expenses incurred by the manufacturer to provide factory authorized service.

#### Quality Assurance

- ◆ The VFD and options shall comply with the applicable requirements of the latest standards of ANSI, IEEE, and the National Electrical Code.
- ◆ The VFD and options shall be tested to ANSI/UL Standard 508 and listed by a nationally recognized testing agency such as UL or ETL.
- ◆ To ensure quality and minimize infant failures at the jobsite, the VFD shall be burned in for 24-hours by the manufacturer.
- ◆ All features shall be functionally tested at the factory for proper operation.

#### Maintenance Materials

- ◆ Furnish two of each filter.



## **Products**

- ♦ Furnish complete variable speed drive(s) as specified herein. All standard and optional features requested shall be included within the VFD enclosure unless otherwise specified. Drives shall be for variable torque load, unless otherwise noted.
- ♦ The variable speed drives shall convert three-phase, 60 HZ utility power to adjustable voltage and frequency, three-phase, AC power for step less motor speed control from 10% to 100% of the motor's 60 Hz speed. Input voltage shall be as specified in the schedule.
- ♦ The VFD power input stage shall convert three-phase AC line power to a fixed DC bus voltage. This will be accomplished with a solid state three-phase full-wave diode rectifier with metal oxide varistor (MOV) three-phase protection. 

- Speed Reference Input: Shall accept both a manual speed signal and a 0-10 VDC speed reference analog input signal from the Building Automation System (BAS).
- Feedback Signal: Provide 0-5 VDC or 0-20 mA analog output signal to indicate actual operating speed of VFD. Output signal shall be fed into the BAS.

  - Protection against input transient voltage spikes.






The meeting was called to order by Mayor Wolf with Commissioner Allen giving the invocation and the audience joining in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

DSD Peavy was sworn in by Mayor Wolf.

- a. PUBLIC HEARING – 2nd FINAL READING Ordinance No. O2010-26, an ordinance adopting the annual update to the Capital Improvement Element of the Comprehensive Plan (Attachments – Staff Recommends Approval)

DSD Peavy explained Statutory requirement to adopt an annual update to the Capital Improvement Element of the Comprehensive Plan, as part of the budget process. The facilities included in the CIE are: Utilities, Transportation, Recreation, Open Space and Public Schools Facilities. This year some proposed improvements are being deleted and new improvements are being added. O2010-26 adopts the update and amending the Comprehensive Plan.

Mayor Wolf introduced and read by title O2010-26, and opened meeting for Public Hearing. No comments were received.

Motion carried by unanimous vote.

- b. PUBLIC HEARING – 2nd FINAL READING Ordinance No. O2010-27, an ordinance correcting Scriveners errors in Ordinance No. 616 (Turkey Run PUD) (Attachments – Staff Recommends Approval)

Mayor Wolf introduced and read by title only O2010-27, and opened meeting for Public Hearing. No comments were received.

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DSD Peavy O2010-27 is to correct scriveners' errors in the legal description in Ordinance No. 616.

Motion by Commissioner Allen, second by Commissioner Strickland that Ordinance No. O2010-27: An Ordinance Of The City Of Wildwood, Florida, Correcting Scriveners Errors Caused By Scriveners Errors Contained In The Property Description Provided By The Original Surveyor In Ordinance Number 616; And Providing For An Effective Date: is adopted on second final reading. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

- c. TIMED ITEM Approval of Resolution No. R2010-36 and of the 2<sup>nd</sup> NOPC (Notice of Proposed Change) to The Villages of Wildwood DRI Development Order (Attachments – Staff Recommends Approval)

Mayor Wolf introduced and read by title R2010-36.

DSD Peavy – In accordance with State Statute 380.06 a Public Hearing date was set for December 13 to discuss the Villages of Wildwood second NOPC to the Development Order for the Villages of Wildwood DRI. The proposed changes to the DRI are to amend the Land Use conversion matrix to include skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities and independent living facilities in the land uses, and adding the 4.71 acres, and amending Map H and Map H-1 to reflect the 4.71 acres to the town center mixed use.

Motion by Commissioner Clark, second by Commissioner Bivins that Resolution No. R2010-36: A Resolution Of The City Commission Of The City Of Wildwood, Florida, Adopting A Second Amendment To The Development Order For The Villages Of Wildwood Development Of Regional Impact; Providing An Effective Date: is adopted. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

- d. TIMED ITEM Final plat approval for Lakeside Landings – Regatta II (Attachments – Staff Recommends Approval)

DSD Peavy – changing multi-family lots to single-family units. It is Phase II. The plat includes 41 single-family residential lots which is a revision to the original plan. All engineering has been approved. Fire, City Engineer and staff recommend approval.

Motion by Commissioner Allen, second by Commissioner Bivins to approve the Final plat for Lakeside Landings – Regatta II. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

- e. TIMED ITEM Approval requested for the Negotiated Settlement Agreement; the Proportionate Share Agreement; and the Amended and Restated Development Order for Landstone DRI (Attachments – Staff Recommends Approval)

DSD Peavy – Negotiated Settlement Agreement came about as the result of DCA's appeal of the original DRI Development Order for Landstone. The

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Settlement states that the City will simultaneously adopt the Agreement with Amended Restated Landstone Communities DRI Development Order. Upon adoption of Settlement Agreement and Amended Restated Landstone Communities DRI DO and submittal to DCA, a Notice of Voluntary Dismissal of the Appeal will be filed. The Amended Restated DO reflects changes made to the original DO after negotiations with DCA, City of Wildwood, Sumter County and Landstone. The Amended Restated DO requires that the Developer adequately mitigate for impact to regionally significant roadway segments anticipated to occur as a result of the development of Phase I of the DRI and that specific transportation improvements may be constructed in connection with the development of Phase I. It was noted that the attached Transportation Proportionate Share Agreement between Landstone-Wright LLC, TML of Marion LLC, City of Wildwood, Sumter County, Lake County, and the Florida Department of Transportation provides a means by which the developer will satisfy the Proportionate Share Agreement provided for in the DO and by which Phase I will be assessed a proportionate share of the costs of constructing the needed transportation improvements required to mitigate for those transportation impacts. The developer's proportionate share shall be allocated to the pipeline facilities which include the four laning of 470, payment toward safety improvement to the intersection of US301 and CR 468 and participation in the Regional Transit Study. The PSA was approved and executed by FDOT on November 1, Sumter County on November 9, and Lake County on November 23. The agreement has been signed by the owners and developers.

Motion by Commissioner Allen, second by Commissioner Clerk to approve the Negotiated Settlement Agreement; the Proportionate Share Agreement; and the Amended and Restated Development Order for Landstone DRI. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Charles Schutter, Chuck Piper and Albert Peak were recognized in the audience.

Charles Schutter expressed gratitude to the City and City Manager for there work and help.

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several PD&E's – Turnpike widening to 8 lanes from Clermont to 301 and 6 lanes from 301 to I75. Looking at two turn lanes from 466 to 301 south. Looking at two turn lanes from 301 to 44.

e. Public Forum (10 minute time limit)

Jay Turner – every month one or two times per month his neighborhood gets brown water. What can be done about it and what is causing it. CM Smith – will be meeting with the Water Director on Tuesday and will discuss. Noted that Mr. Turner has suggested using reverse 9-1-1 when there is a water line break and/or boil water notice to go out.

Gene Baker – commended the Commission and City on efforts to stop loitering and have police more visible west of 301. However a concern he has is that youth are provoking police and police provoke the kids. Would like to see the two teams work together. Feel that when something is taken from the youth then something should be given back. Police come and loiterers scatter. Police leave and loiterers come back. Need to put something in place for the kids to do. Would like to get on task force or planning committee in reference to giving the youth who are loitering something to do. Same youth and same corners day in and day out. Same police come. Like a big circle. There has to be a plan that when they leave they stay gone. City has them on the run, but where are they running to.

CM Smith – City is working on more recreation activities with a basketball league scheduled to begin in March at the old middle school gym and continuation of flag football. Noted that donated time for referees and donated equipment would help keep the costs down.

Mayor Wolf – need Mr. Baker to keep an watch when the leagues begin to see if the same people keep loitering. His experience is that some loiter because they want to. We can make our best effort.

Gene Baker – no, we need to make the effort. Worked with juveniles for ten years and there is a way to reach them. If they are not reached, we will continue to have the problem. Get sick and tired of coming up here, talking about we have a problem with loitering. Raised in Melbourne FL where there was a greater problem but the City and Commission got together and stopped the problem. Now live in Ocala where there was an area called little Vietnam. The police would not even enter it. The community and the Commission got together and the problem no longer exist. There is a way to reach the community with strategic planning. It is up to us to find that way. These are kids, not thugs. They are trying to get up and we are allowing them and giving them the power by not implementing a plan. I have the experience and want to be on this committee. Three levels of success – I tried, I do my best, I do whatever it takes. I am not going to rest until the loitering is stopped.

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Commissioner Strickland – the City has a Parks and Recreation Board and if Mr. Baker is interested in serving on that board, that may be the most appropriate way for his input to be provided into a plan. If interested the Commission could appoint him to the board. Gene Baker – will do whatever it takes.

Commissioner Bivins – but is it the Parks & Rec Board place to prevent loitering? It is their place to create activities and activities have been created. Jason Hargrove has an outline.

CM Smith – With the short staff, there are only so many activities that can be planned. The Chief is working on the loitering and will continue to do so.

Jay Turner – the activities planned, flag football and basketball, where is the advertisement being done. There are no signs on the west side. The only thing advertised on the west side was the Easter egg hunt. To get involved the kids have to see the advertisement. CM Smith indicated signs will be placed at the MLK Outreach Center and the MLK Park. Commissioner Strickland – flyers were given out at the schools for the basketball league.

Commissioner Bivins – information is being given to the children and hopefully it is getting home. However, all the activities are being laid out and everything that can be done is being done as far as Parks & Rec, but that is not the place to deal with the issues that go on, on the west side. We can create the activities, we can create all the recreation for them, but still it is a bigger issue than have given them somewhere to go.

Commissioner Strickland – agree with that and may have misunderstood and thought Mr. Baker was looking for places for when the loiterers left where were they going. Thought is was looking to offer ideas.

Commissioner Bivins – asked Mr. Baker is any of the loiterers he can identify have participated in any of the activities already in place, such as flag football. Is anyone trying to get that group to create a team, because that should not be Parks & Rec responsibility.

Mr. Baker – I have a ministry and we made an effort to get a football team started. It was too expensive for the families. Had someone come from Orlando who was going to incorporate them into his league, but decided not to because of the travel. We did try to get some type of football league together for the kids on the westside, and believe it went so far as to the City asking them to provide a schedule of when they would want to use the park. We did make efforts to incorporate football teams for the westside to where it would be economical for the kids on that side.

Commissioner Bivins – so it is not then so much what is being set up, it's the economic side of it to do whatever the City is setting up. Mr. Baker – yes, and we need a happy medium. You have activities for our kids on the east side where we have to activities on the west side.

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Mayor Wolf – I thought we got away from east side, west side, separate but equal. Yet all I am hearing recently is we want separate but equal facilities and separate but equal leagues.

Mr. Baker – first time he heard one community was when John Johnson was a Commissioner stated at a Martin Luther King event, let's make this not for the west side, it's one community, one city. It sounded wonderful and that is the way it should be, however, we do not have one community, we have an east side and a west side.

Mayor Wolf – we have had people who live on the west side come and say they do not want to hear the tracks used to separate the east side and west side again, and the east side – west side just perpetuates the division.

Mr. Baker – I detest east side – west side, but it is apparent to him that we over here feel isolated. I feel like these kids don't have anything. Growing up in Melbourne I had a recreation department to go to. I had a boy scout club to go to. I didn't have time to hang on the corner the way these kids do.

Mayor Wolf – if you walk around the City you will see that it is diverse.

Commissioner Bivins – reiterated that the problem is bigger than a Parks & Rec issue. However, when things are planned, it is planned for everybody. May say that some can't afford to do what is planned and that is another issue. Then maybe something else needs to be done or looked at or find a way to defray the cost. This summer we didn't have enough kids to register for the Summer Program.

CM Smith – noted that the Bernstein's who ran the City program had started their own program with a lower price. For the flag football program the Millennium Park facility was the best location. The City has been offered an indoor facility at the Middle School for the basketball program, which is the best and safest location. The locations were not chosen to split the City. Commissioner Allen – Robert Hannah brought up the idea of the Middle School gym.

Commissioner Bivins – there is a registration fee for the basketball and the referees will be paid from those funds. Looking for volunteer coaches.

CM Smith – will be looking for team sponsorships.

Norvel Scott – through CDBG – is there some way to get some after school programs going. CM Smith – it is mostly for capital improvements. Mr. Baker has a program through his ministry and I was hoping that through some type of grant we could try to get a grant to assist underprivileged children. I agree that we have to look at the entire community as a whole and that is one thing our organization is looking at to try to enhance and trying to help out in those areas. Have 30 years of background in coaching and would be willing to volunteer. Worked in Parks & Rec for 10 years in Deerfield Beach. I believe if we come up with a committee to try to see where we could blend together and try to work together to come up with a plan of action to help

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all youth. There is underprivileged in a lot of groups. I believe if we come up with a diverse plan that would be suitable for everybody that we can work with all kids. Not look at just one race but all children as created equal. I think that is the direction we should go in. I am will to sit on any board of the City. I said when I first came that I here to unit and be a part of this community. Come here, worship here in this City, serve as the president of this organization and just as I stated to them tonight, if we are going to be a part of something, we should feel like we are the best, we're number one at whatever we do. I feel we need to come together and work together on both sides and come up with comprehensive that will be good for both of us, and that is what I am willing to do. You can count on me to work and would be willing to go back into coaching if that would help offset some of the expenditures. If we can get a package to take back to my organization and see if we could sponsor a group, I would try to do that.

Yvonne Jackson – there are a few kids that play in a basketball league but not in the City. There is a group that play football and basketball in Lake County, Inverness, Ocala and Tampa. Noted that she has bumped heads with Commissioners, the Mayor and Chief Reeser, but they have sat down and worked it out. Over the years there have been disagreements but have been working on it. It could take 25 years and it all may not be changed, but need to continue to work on it. Her concern about the basketball group is the age – 7 to 15. There are kids who are 16 that need something also. The loiterers are not in that age group. Working together is how the corner has been cleared to the point it has been.

CM Smith – trying to do what we can and as it is successful add to it. Looking at all age groups and what are the things the different ages want to do.

Commissioner Bivins – we have to put the right thing in place. We have to target the right thing and get the right mix, so we don't continue to have this. It is a problem that needs to be addressed, but it is not all recreation, it is deeper than that.

CM Smith – will talk with Chief Reeser and bring back some strategies and ideas to Commission in January. Mayor Wolf – the Parks committee could also offer some input, but all have to understand that the City does not have an open check book. Everything he has heard goes back to the TV announcement – Do you know where your kids are?

Walter Jackson – Commissioner Bivins is correct in that it is larger than a basketball or football. Need to give children something more than a round ball. This is 2010, we need something more. We need a community center where you bring people in and teach them, talk to them and show them how to upgrade themselves from where they are. You said don't talk about the east and the west, that is fine, but if you drive through the east and then the west, it is like another city. You are telling me there is not a difference. Stop playing on peoples' intelligence. There is a big difference and something needs to be done about it. We need to sit down with a plan. We need to educate the young people. That is what we need to do. You are right – where is your child at 10 o'clock at night. Well, who are the parents. We have to build with what we

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are dealing with, what kind of parents we are dealing with. We have got to do something to connect to our young people. Someone said they watched the police today come out and the kids run in different directions. That is a waste of money. We need somewhere to put them and to train them in a trade or something. We closed that school up there, do we have any trade teaching people. Do we have a program that will teach a child to be a plumber, electrician? These are things that we need. This is where the money should be going to for these kind of programs and when the Middle School closed that is what should have gone there, a trade school. You had the building and the parking lot. You would be surprised at the companies that would give you a grant for that kind of activity.

Mayor Wolf – the Middle School belongs to the school board not the City.

**HISTORY/FACTS/ISSUES:**

The Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) have started a remapping project in Sumter County that will create new digital flood hazard maps, known as Digital Flood Insurance Rate Maps (DFIRMs). The new county wide DFIRMs will show the extent to which areas of the county are currently at risk for flooding.

The flood and hazard risk information shown on the current flood maps has not been reassessed since 1980. The map updates will provide up-to-date information using the new available data and provided in a digital format.

The agreement to work with SWFWMD and FEMA will be beneficial as we work toward informing the public of flood-prone areas and how the map changes may affect property owners in Wildwood.

Preliminary flood maps should be released and Flood Risk Open Houses should be held by Summer 2011. A period of public comment and appeals will open around Fall 2011 and new flood maps, flood insurance and building requirements will take effect by Summer 2012.

## Community Partner Memorandum of Agreement

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**AGREEMENT** is made on December 8, 2010, by these parties: City of Wildwood, the Southwest Florida Water Management District (District), and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

**BECAUSE** the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), established by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, has several purposes, the most significant being:

- To better indemnify individuals from losses through the availability of flood insurance;
- To reduce future flood damages through community floodplain management regulations; and
- To reduce costs for disaster assistance and flood control.

**BECAUSE** a critical component of this program is the identification and mapping of the nation's floodplains to create a broad-based awareness of the flood hazard and to provide the data necessary for community floodplain management programs and to actuarially rate flood insurance;

**BECAUSE** FEMA administers the NFIP and is authorized by §1360 of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended (42 U.S.C. 4101), to establish and update flood-risk zone data in floodplain areas.

**BECAUSE**, in the identification of flood-prone areas, FEMA is authorized to consult with, receive information from, and enter into agreements or other arrangements with the head of any State, regional, or local agency in order to identify these flood-prone areas;

**BECAUSE** FEMA encourages strong Federal, State, regional, and local partnerships for the purposes of reducing flood losses and disaster assistance; and FEMA and its State, regional, and local partners have determined that it is advantageous to encourage and formalize greater cooperation in the flood hazard identification and mapping processes;

**BECAUSE** City of Wildwood participates in the NFIP, and City of Wildwood has been deemed by FEMA to be in good standing in the NFIP; and

**BECAUSE** City of Wildwood and the District have expressed a desire to cooperate with FEMA in the flood hazard identification process and has worked with FEMA to identify and prioritize Wildwood's flood mapping needs and develop a scope of study to produce an updated digital flood map.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed that the parties enter into this agreement to work together to produce an updated, digital flood map for unincorporated Sumter County and the incorporated communities of Bushnell, Center Hill, Coleman, Webster, and Wildwood.



**SCOPE OF SERVICES**

**December 20, 2010**

**Project Description:**

The City of Wildwood, located in central Sumter County, is a regional provider of water, wastewater and reclaimed water services. In 2005 BFA developed a Master Plan for the City based on the planned growth in their service area. Over the past 5 years, the City has made changes to the service area, land use and demand projections based on the changing growth patterns in the City's service area. The City has also recently adopted a Comprehensive Plan that reflects these planning level changes.

To be consistent with the recently adopted Comprehensive Plan, the City requires an update of the transmission system analysis previously included in the 2005 Master Plan.. The Transmission System Update will include hydraulic modeling of the water, wastewater and reclaimed water systems based on the current projected growth within the City's service area. In addition, the City now has available land area to expand their existing wastewater treatment plant. The previous wastewater transmission system analysis was based on treatment being provided at two facilities, the existing WWTP and a future WWTP at the proposed Landstone Development. This analysis will evaluate and provide a conceptual costing analysis of a single WWTP at the existing expanded site and an updated two WWTP alternative.

The planning period for this project is 2035. The primary scope of services for the Transmission System Update is as follows:

**Task 1 – Water Transmission System Analysis**

**1.1 Data Collection**

Data gathering will focus on compiling available information and identifying sources of information necessary to provide an update of the water system hydraulic model. It is anticipated that the following data will be provided by the City:

- Existing and future land use within the service area in GIS;
- Historical and projected water demand data;
- Planned developments within the service area;
- Customer billing data;
- Water system components in GIS including water plants, high service pumping facilities, storage facilities, water transmission/distribution pipes.

## 1.2 Potable Water System Hydraulic Model

Update the existing hydraulic model of the potable water distribution system and perform hydraulic analysis to identify necessary transmission system improvements to meet future capacity requirements.

- A. BFA will input the base data of the City's existing system into an H<sub>2</sub>O Map hydraulic model. The hydraulic model will include the following elements:
- Pipelines 8 inches and larger for model scenarios. 6 inch pipes will only be included where looped with larger transmission mains. Smaller pipelines may be overlayed into the model for visual and connectivity evaluation, but will not be included in the hydraulic analysis.
  - High service pumps stations and elevated storage tanks.
  - Nodes/Junctions to represent commercial, residential and fire flow demands.
- B. Three demand scenarios will be modeled to simulate/determine system capacity and reliability. Demand scenarios will include Average Daily Flow (ADF), Max Day Flow plus Fire Flow (MD) and Peak Hour Flow (PH). Only the future demand at 2035 will be analyzed to determine future transmission main layout and sizing. This analysis will assume only two WTP's are in use, the future Champagne Farms WTP and an upgraded facility at the current CR501 WTP site.
- C. Demand Allocation - Methodology utilized for allocation of system baseline demands to model nodes will be based on land-use/population data and unit demands.
- D. Calibration
1. City to perform a minimum of three hydrant tests at outlying hydrants in the system and provide baseline pressure data from various parts of the system.
  2. Flow and pressure data obtained from the hydrant tests and baseline pressure data will be utilized for model calibration.
  3. Model calibration will be conducted utilizing the following guidelines:
  4. Modeled hydraulic grade line (HGL) to be within 5 to 10 feet at calibration points during hydrant tests and within the accuracy of the elevation and pressure data during normal demands.

### 1.3 Deliverables

BFA will update the future transmission system map of the future improvements required for study period.

## **Task 2 - Wastewater And Reclaimed Water Transmission System Analysis**

### 2.1 Data Collection

Data gathering will focus on compiling available information and identifying sources of information necessary to provide an update of the wastewater system and reclaimed water system hydraulic models. It is anticipated that the data will be provided by the City and include the following:

- Existing and future land use within the service area in GIS;
- Historical and projected wastewater flow data;
- Planned developments within the service area;
- Wastewater and effluent disposal/reuse system components in GIS including gravity sewer and force mains, lift stations, wastewater treatment plants, reclaimed water storage facilities, reclaimed water transmission system, and effluent disposal/reuse sites.

### 2.2 Wastewater Treatment Facility Siting Alternatives Analysis

Activities under this task will focus on siting additional treatment facilities either adjacent to the existing facilities or at a new site located at future development in the south portion of the City's service area. Based on wastewater flow projections, the capacity and approximate size of the additional treatment facilities will be estimated. Relative cost considerations will be used to evaluate and provide a conceptual costing analysis of a single WWTP at the existing expanded site and an updated two WWTP alternative.

### 2.3 Wastewater Transmission System

Update the previous wastewater transmission system hydraulic model and perform hydraulic analysis to identify the future system to meet future capacity requirements.

A. Input updated base data of the City's existing system into an H<sub>2</sub>O Map hydraulic model. The hydraulic model will include the following elements:

- Pressurized wastewater transmission mains for the various model scenarios.
- Wastewater pumping stations.
- Wastewater Treatment Plant Sites.

- B. A Flow Model analysis will be performed to simulate and determine system capacity and future transmission main sizing. The Flow Model will include simulated system peak flow with pump stations offline and system flow determined by user inputs. General locations of future pump stations will be shown to capture project wastewater flows in undeveloped areas but will not be analyzed for available sites.

Due to project scheduling a Pump Model analysis will not be included with this study. A Pump Model is used to simulate system peak flows with pump stations online and system flow determined by actual pump curve data.

- C. Wastewater Flow Allocation - Methodology utilized for allocation of system baseline wastewater flow will be based on land-use/population data and unit demands provided by the City.

#### 2.4 Reclaimed Water System

Develop a hydraulic model of the current reclaimed water transmission system and perform hydraulic analysis to identify necessary pumping and piping system improvements to meet future capacity requirements.

- A. BFA will input the base data of the City's existing system into an H<sub>2</sub>O Map hydraulic model. The hydraulic model will include the following elements:
- Pipelines 8 inches and larger for model scenarios. 6 inch pipes will only be included where looped with larger transmission mains. Smaller pipelines may be overlaid into the model for visual and connectivity evaluation, but will not be included in the hydraulic analysis.
  - High service pumping facilities.
  - Nodes/Junctions to represent commercial, residential and industrial customer irrigation demands.
- B. Three demand scenarios will be modeled to simulate and determine system capacities. Demand scenarios will include the following Average Daily Flow (ADF), Max Day Flow (MDF) and Peak Hour Flow (PH) based on estimated peaking factors. The analysis will assume that the existing reuse methods will continue as currently planned and reclaimed water will be provided to all new growth. This analysis will not include siting of future reuse sites except those associated with future developments.

### **Task 3 – Report Preparation**

The activities listed in Tasks 1 and 2 will be documented in a Water, Wastewater and Reclaimed Water Transmission System Update Report.

#### 3.1 Draft

The report will summarize the information in Tasks 1 and 2 using tables and figures to the maximum extent possible. The report will include the development of maps and figures depicting the City's future water, wastewater and reclaimed water system components. Four (4) copies of the draft document will be supplied to the City for review and comment.

#### 3.2 Final

City review comments will be incorporated into the document and ten (10) copies of the final document will be provided to the City.

### **Compensation**

BFA shall complete the scope of services for the development of the Water, Wastewater and Reclaimed Water Transmission System Update described above for a lump sum fee of \$25,268. A breakdown of the proposed fee by each task is provided in Attachment A.
